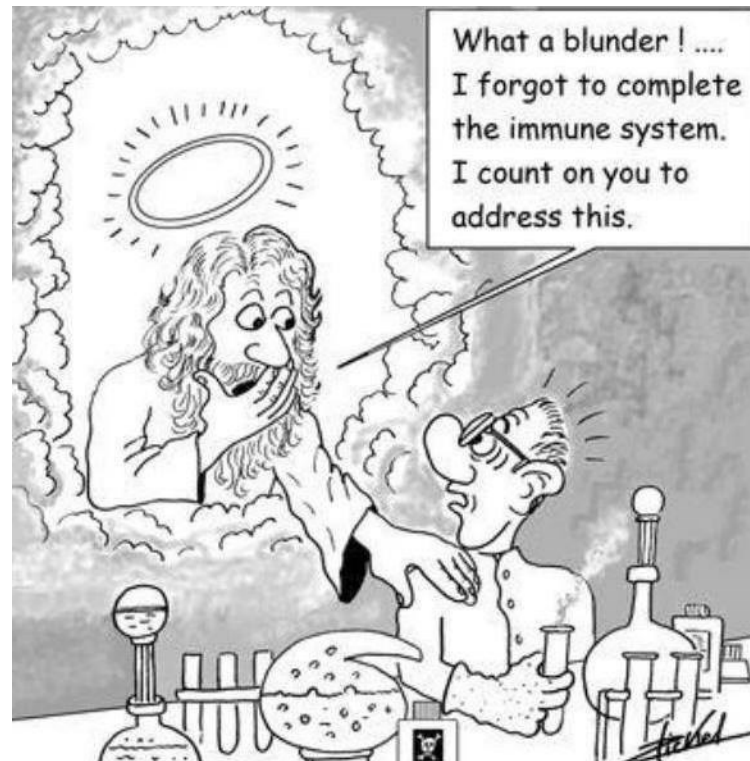

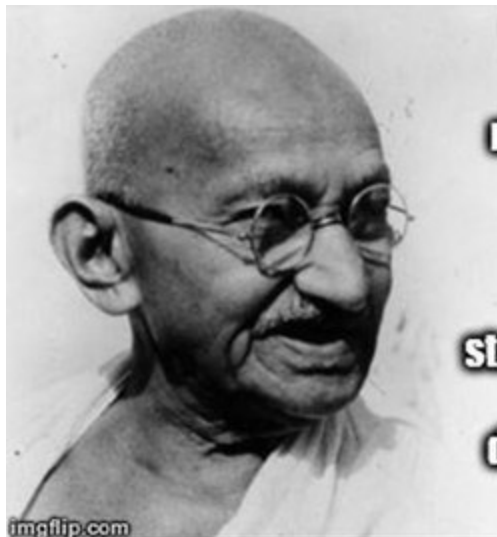

Vaccination and Belief

Vaccination raises medical, philosophical and religious questions. The purpose of this webinar is to discuss religious & moral aspects of the issue: to vaccinate, or not. Which is the moral choice? For both the individual and for the parent...

Is it morally legitimate for a parent/guardian to subject a child to an uninsurable medical procedure (vaccination) which is known to have foreseeable harm to some children, for the "greater good" or is this a type of sacrifice to Moloch? **Does any adult ever have moral authority to submit any child to such risk? This Church teaches: "No."**



Vaccination is a barbarous practice and one of the most fatal of all the delusions current in our time.

Conscientious objectors to vaccination should stand alone, if need be, against the whole world, in defence of their conviction.

The moral dilemma that many face is in the perceived conflict between what they are told about the alleged collective good to be achieved by having a fully vaccinated population (against every disease for which a vaccine may be concocted...)

Versus

Your obligation as a parent to protect your child from foreseeable harm. Can any parent be morally or legally obligated to risk their child – to offer them to the “Fires of Moloch” -- for the “greater good?” How can there be both “Informed Consent” and compulsion?



Vaccination and Belief

The beliefs of each church must be respected: "...neither this court nor any branch of this government will consider the merits or fallacies of a religion. Nor will the court compare the beliefs, dogmas, and practices of a newly organized religion with those of an older, more established religion."

Universal Life Church, Inc. vs. United States, 372 F. Supp. 770, 776 (E.D. Cal 1974)



State v Biggs (46 SE Reporter 401, 1903): there can be no "state system of healing" p.402 and while "Those who wish to be treated by practitioners of medicine and surgery had the guaranty that such practitioners had been duly examined...those who had faith in treatment by methods not included in the 'practice of medicine and surgery' as usually understood, had reserved to them the right to practice their faith and be treated, if they chose, by those who openly and avowedly did not use either surgery or drugs in the treatment of diseases..."

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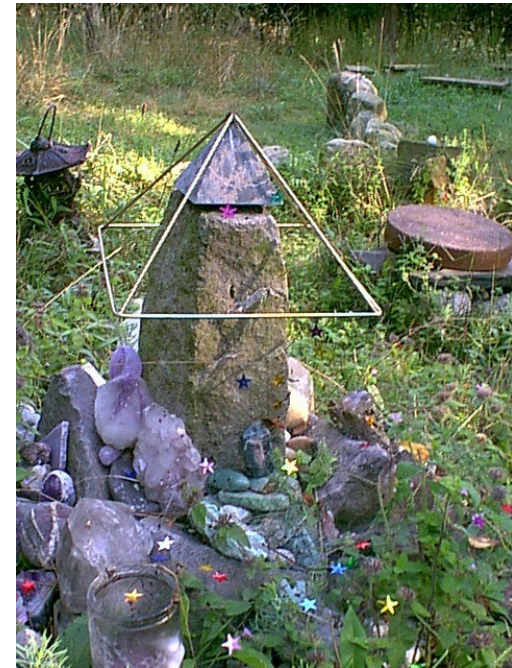
Church *Bona Fides*

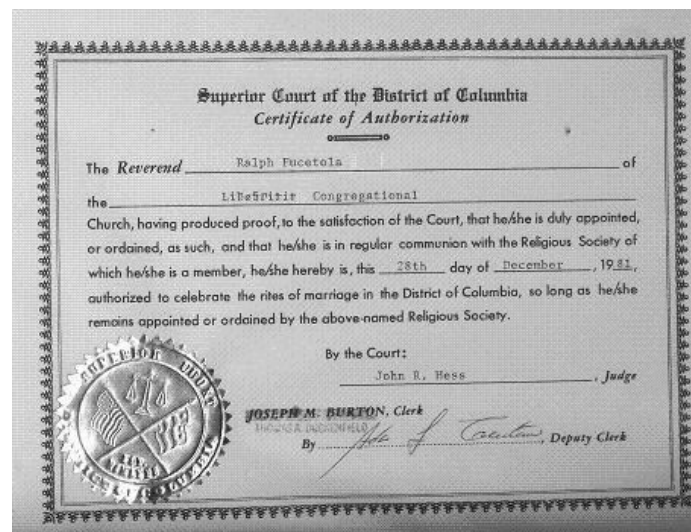

Moved by the SPIRIT OF LIFE:

WHEREAS the Libertarian Congregational Church was founded on August 23, 1974 and the Trustees thereof met on September 14, 1974 (pursuant to an Action of the Congregation of Elders made at a Meeting in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S. 16:1-1 and the By-Laws, on Sunday, September 8, 1974) and unanimously agreed to incorporate themselves as a Religious Society. Whereupon, on September 27, 1974 the Trustees executed a Certificate of Incorporation which was filed on September 30, 1974 with the Clerk of Bergen County in Book 326, page 306 et seq. The aforesaid Certificate was amended at a meeting on August 16, 1975, and an Amendment to Certificate of Incorporation was executed by the Trustees on August 20, 1975 and filed with the Clerk of Bergen County on September 3, 1975 in Book 328 page 210.

WHEREAS the Congregation of Elders, by unanimous Action at the Meeting of September 20, 1986 determined to modify the name of the Church to more explicitly proclaim the Spirit of Life and adopt a new Seal, and the Trustees having unanimously consented, the name of the Church has been modified as of the 1st day of January, 1987, to Lifespirit Congregational Church, and the Church may be described as the Lifespirit Collaborative Congregations, but, the existing congregations are privileged to continue to use the names they have heretofore used.

THEREFORE this Amended Certificate of Incorporation is made as of the 1st. day of January, 1987.

Re: By-Law on Religious Beliefs regarding Vaccination

Many of the ministers and elders of the LifeSpirit Congregational Church are deeply troubled by the proliferation of vaccination and the spiritual harm arising from this invasion of the Body Temple, and have asked for Guidance from the Church. Such Guidance has been received directly from Source. This is an obligatory statement of doctrine and belief, binding upon all communicants, their children and companion animals.

The Ministers of the Church are authorized by the Church to engage in pastoral counseling with communicants who are concerned about the morality of vaccination and other abominations, and to issue, when the Minister is reasonably certain of the beliefs of the communicant, a Pastoral Counseling Letter to the communicant attesting to the individual's sincere religious objection to vaccination or other abomination. Such letter may also include minor children, companion animals and other dependents.

Religious Injunction

Thus says the Source: "Thou shalt not allow the entry of abominations and unholiness into the bodies of thine children, companions and thine own selves, for they are Gods' Temples and sacred unto thine Source."

Source states: "LCC communicants are specifically directed by their ecclesiastical supervisors to object to, and refuse, any of the following unholiness and abominations, entering the Body Temple: of themselves or their children as a violation of the free exercise of their religious beliefs and the moral obligations of their religion: the administering of vaccination, human or other blood, chemo-therapy, radiation and other non-natural remedies are declared to be unholy abominations; the use of injection or otherwise to administer abominations is declared to interfere with the practice of religion."

The making of this Religious Injunction, and adhering to it by communicants, is declared to be the Religious Expression of the LifeSpirit and an exercise of our Expressive Association.

Religious Injunction: Obligations of Communicants and Instructions to Parents

Based upon the consensus of the ministers and elders, this Statement of Doctrine and Religious Injunction is posted on the Church web site, www.lifespirt.org, as a Church By-Law for downloading by all believers and communicants who are hereby authorized to present same to school or other authorities as the basis for our religious objection to any vaccination or other abominations that violate our Belief in the sacred nature of the Person, by including any of the spiritually objectionable substances listed above, or by being administered in violation of the Religious Injunction set forth herein.

Parents are enjoined to object to vaccination upon the ground that the proposed immunization interferes with the free exercise of the pupil's religious rights and that the administration of vaccination or other abomination interferes with religious belief and exercise, violating the Expressive Association of the communicants.

Thus the Source has spoken, and so it is.

Religious Injunction

Vaccine Refuser Status

People are concerned about the consequences of being a Vaccine Refuser. It is my considered professional opinion [as a *Juris Doctor* and retired attorney] that, under the US Constitution, you have an inalienable right to control your own body and what is done with your body. You are a free person, not a slave.



“Be Harmless...”

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Jacobson v Massachusetts

Let's start with the case often cited as the “lead case” in vaccination law, Jacobson v. Commonwealth of Massachusetts, 197 U.S. 11 (1905). This case is often erroneously cited as authority for mandatory vaccinations.

The case is rather more nuanced and announces compelling authority for Federal Court intervention in vaccination matters. While giving due deference to the State authorities, the Supreme Court reserved for the Federal Courts the right to intervene in matters where health and life may be at stake:

“...if it be apparent or can be shown with reasonable certainty that he is not at the time a fit subject of vaccination or that vaccination, by reason of his then condition, would seriously impair his health or probably cause his death.”



Jacobson v Massachusetts

While Jacobson did not prevail in the Supreme Court, it is to be noted that he never alleged harm or peril of harm; he only alleged that the mandating of the emergency influenza vaccination was *ultra vires* the state's authority and the \$5.00 (in Silver Coin, worth about \$100 2019 fiat dollars) fine imposed was unconstitutional. The Court held the fine constitutional.

Jacobson was never actually forced to be vaccinated and history shows us that the \$5.00 fine was later vacated. Furthermore, the case was decided before the comprehensive Federal pre-emption of drug approval that is now embodied in the laws empowering the FDA.

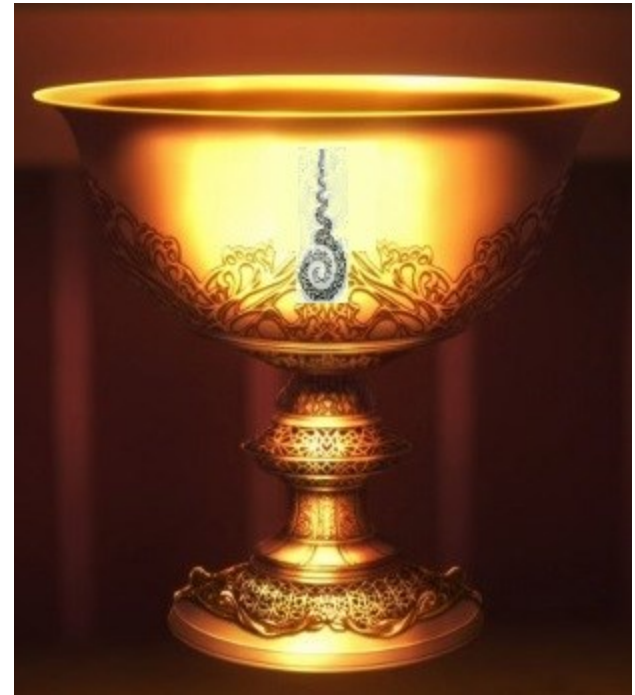


State Exemption Laws

Nearly all US states allow religious exemptions, while some also recognize philosophical objections.

All states permit proper medical exemptions.

There are holistic physicians who will, based on the patient's history as relayed by the parents, issue a letter that says, due to prior vaccine reactions, further vaccinations are contra-indicated.

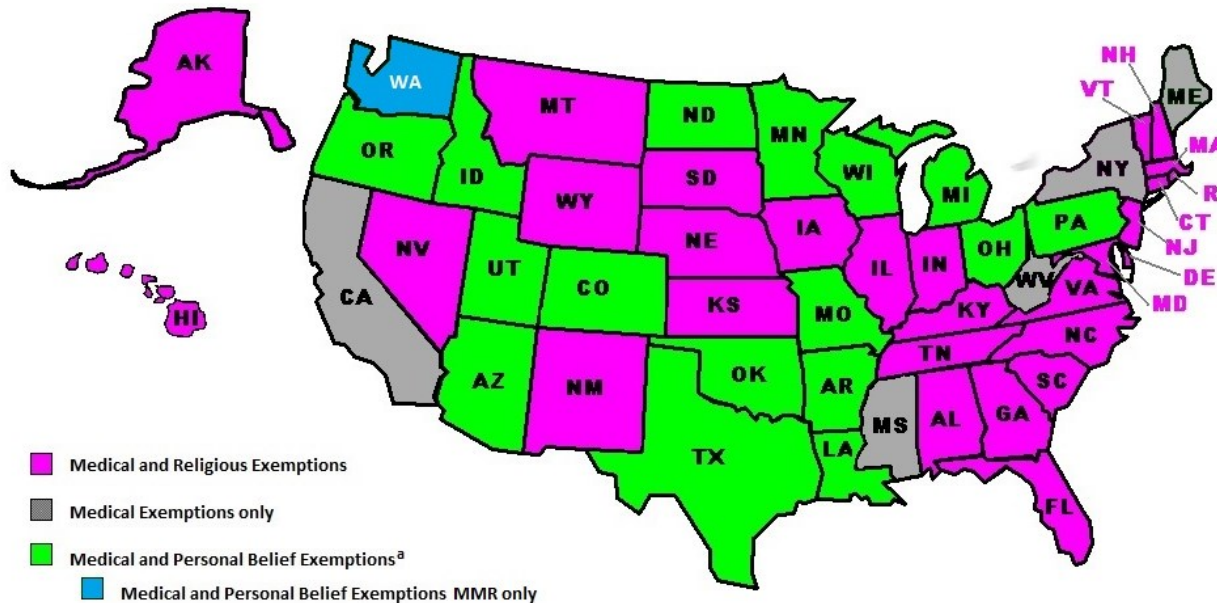




State Exemption Laws

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Historical Conscientious Objection

American Society has a Spotty Record with Regard to Respect for Conscientious Objectors.

Amish objectors to public education and other civic requirements resulted in several generations of confrontation between the Amish and Federal and State authorities. Only after a number of Amish men were imprisoned did the courts begin to recognize their right to withdraw from civil society and maintain their own private associations.

Later cases, such as *Dale vs Boy Scouts* and the Native American Church peyote cases, suggest that US courts will now broadly implement private expressive association rights.

Conscientious Objection to the military draft (involuntary military servitude) reached new levels during the war in Viet Nam. At the start of that war, only the members of certain pacifist churches could claim CO status. By the end of the war, most anyone whose personal anti-war beliefs held (in their lives) the same status as traditional pacifist beliefs held in the lives of believers, could assert CO status.

This development of the law is similar to the 2014 New Jersey flu shot-refusal unemployment insurance case, above.

We see by considering this history of Conscientious Objection that the American court system can be expected to offer considerable protection to Vaccine Refuser Conscientious Objectors.



Pastoral Counseling

Here is the Procedure I follow for pastoral counseling (this process should be followed by any LifeSpirit minister providing vaccination or other ministerial counselling):

1. I receive an initial communication from someone and reply.
2. The communicant pays our voluntary donation (we request \$100 - payable via PayPal at: <http://lifespirit.org/donations.html> -- this is a deductible donation and the PayPal receipt is the receipt record).
3. I have a ministerial counseling conference call with the individual (other members of the family are invited to participate if they wish).
4. I issue and email the Pastoral Letter (it has the Seal and my signature as printable images). In some cases, based on employer or school requirements, it may be necessary to have the statement Notarized, and if so, those costs should be covered as well.
5. I also provide a three-page "bona fides" document attesting to our Church's legal status and beliefs.

Who can qualify for a Letter? Any communicant of LifeSprit Church with *bona fide* religious beliefs can qualify. We do not keep lists of communicants. More about becoming a LifeSpirit minister at our web site, www.LifeSpirit.org



Pastoral Counseling Letter

After an introduction which describes the Church and lists the family members by name the letter continues:

“The Communicant does not give Informed Consent for vaccination. This separate conscientious objection and refusal to give Informed Consent is not predicated on any statutory exemption but is based upon the universal right to Informed Consent.

“It is my professional pastoral opinion that the Communicant and his Family Members sincerely hold bona fide religious beliefs that cause each of them to validly object, on religious and conscientious grounds, to the administration of vaccines or other invasive medical interventions. The Religious Exemption is based on a bona fide religious objection and sincerely held primary religious belief.

Pastoral Counseling Letter

The letter concludes:

**The correct ICD-10-CM Code that applies is Z28.1
“Vaccination not carried out for religious reasons.”**

This assertion of Religious Right is protected under state and federal law, including the First Amendment, the Restoration of Religious Freedom Act and the 1964 Civil Rights Act: Sec. 201, 202, 203 and 204.

Communicants object in writing that the administration of immunizing agents conflicts with their religious tenets or practices.

Informed Consent

The Common Law recognizes the right of individual autonomy over decisions relating to one's health and welfare and the courts have declared "individuals have a common law right to determine for themselves whether to allow a physical invasion of their bodies" and that "Every competent adult has a right to forego treatment, or even cure, if it entails what for him are intolerable consequences or risks however unwise his sense of values may be in the eyes of the medical profession." [1]

The New York Supreme Court declared "every human being of adult years and sound mind has a right to determine what shall be done with his own body..." [2]

The Due Process Clause of the Fourteenth Amendment, states that no state may "deprive a person of life, liberty or property without due process of law." Courts have decided that the Fourteenth Amendment protection encompasses a constitutionally protected right to refuse unwanted medical interventions, including the "principle that a competent person has a constitutionally protected liberty interest in refusing unwanted medical treatment." [3]

Recently the United States Supreme Court has clearly declared, even a "... diminished expectation of privacy does not diminish the... privacy interest in preventing a government agent from piercing the... skin. And though a blood test conducted in a medical setting by trained personnel is less intrusive than other bodily invasions, this Court has never retreated from its recognition that any compelled intrusion into the human body implicates significant, constitutionally protected privacy interests..." [4]

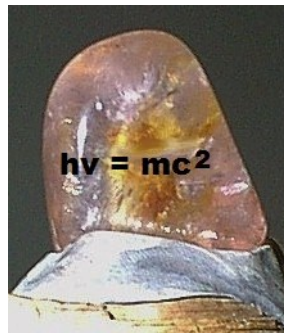

Re: Pastoral Counseling

Dear xxx,

Thank you for your private communication. We are certainly available to provide ministerial counseling with regard to this troubling concern. The link above gives you access to our teaching on vaccinations. Currently several states are in the process of abrogating long-standing religious conscientious exemptions to vaccination. We do not know how long the exemptions will be honored. We do, however, know that you must assert your conscientious objection (refusal of Informed Consent) or it will be deemed waived. Therefore, our pastoral counseling now also includes a discussion of the universal right to Informed Consent as that right impacts religious belief.

After such counseling, our standard letter, notarized and issued over our Church Seal, covers the fact that we consulted and our professional opinion regarding your sincere religious beliefs. We list the names and ages of any minor children and also include the "not vaccinated for religious reasons" appropriate medical code. The concluding paragraph then states:

"I therefore, over the Official Seal of the Church, call upon all public child welfare, employer, military, health care, school, public safety, emergency and martial law authorities to recognize and accommodate, under the Civil Rights Acts, the religious conscientious objections to vaccination of Communicants, and to permit same to receive medical care only upon Informed Consent, work, attend school, receive all public benefits, passing the public ways unmolested, or to self-shield at home or voluntarily chosen location without interference or limitation, as an expressive association Right."

As noted, we include the Industry Code for "not vaccinated due to religious objection" so the school or agency has an "official" regulation upon which to rely. I need to know in which State you reside; your family members' names. The procedure I follow is this:

1. We receive an initial communication from someone such as yourself and reply. **[Done]**
2. The communicant pays our voluntary donation (we request \$100 - payable via PayPal at: <http://www.lifespirit.org/donations.html> -- this is a tax deductible donation and your PayPal receipt is your tax record).
3. We have a short ministerial counseling conference call (other members of your family are invited to participate if they wish).
4. You provide us with the names, DOB, and other pertinent information about the Family Members involved
5. We issue the notarized Pastoral Letter and email it to you (it has the Seal and the minister's signature as printable images).
6. We can also provide a three-page "bona fides" document attesting to our Church's legal status and beliefs.

Re: Religious Vaccination Exemption Pastoral Letter

LifeSpirit Congregational Church is a duly recognized church organization. I have been a duly ordained and licensed minister since 1974. During the period of my ministry I have counseled many families and individuals regarding their religious beliefs and how those beliefs affect their expressive association activities in the secular world, including health care issues. I have counseled [NAMES] as Communicants of the Church. We have discussed Communicants' sincere religious beliefs and how those beliefs impact Expressive Association. Our Church doctrine explicitly excludes vaccination as a violation of religious beliefs and an abomination.

The Communicants do *not* give Informed Consent for vaccination. This conscientious objection and refusal to give Informed Consent is not predicated on any statutory exemption but is based on the universal right to Informed Consent.

It is my professional pastoral opinion that the Communicants sincerely hold *bona fide* religious beliefs that cause each to validly object on religious and conscientious grounds to the administration of vaccines or other invasive medical interventions. **The Religious Exemption is based on a *bona fide* religious objection.**

The correct ICD-10-CM Code that applies is Z28.1 "Vaccination not carried out for religious reasons." This assertion of Religious Right is protected under state and federal law, including the First Amendment, the Restoration of Religious Freedom Act and the 1964 Civil Rights Act: Sec. 201, 202, 203 and 204. Communicants object in writing that the administration of immunizing agents conflicts with their religious tenets or practices.

Communicants request accommodation of their beliefs under the Civil Rights Act.

On October 6, 2017 the United States Attorney General released a Memorandum for all Executive Departments and Agencies regarding Federal Law Protections for Religious Liberty. In this memorandum Attorney General Jeff Sessions' first point is that the freedom of religion is a fundamental right of paramount importance, expressly protected by federal law. The free exercise of religion is not a mere policy preference to be traded against other policy preferences. It is a fundamental right.





The Attorney General continues to say that The Religious Freedom Restoration Act of 1993 (RFRA) prohibits the federal government (and any agency receiving federal funds) from substantially burdening any aspect of religious observance or practice unless imposition of that burden on a particular religious adherent satisfies strict scrutiny. Furthermore, a government action substantially burdens an exercise of religion under RFRA if it bans an aspect of an adherent's religious observance or practice, or compels an act inconsistent with that observance or practice, or substantially pressures the adherent to modify such observance or practice.

I therefore, over the Official Seal of the Church, call upon all child welfare, employer, military, health care, school, public safety, emergency and martial law authorities to recognize and accommodate, under the Civil Rights Acts, the *bona fide* religious conscientious objections to vaccination of Communicants, and to permit same to receive medical care only upon Informed Consent, work, attend school, receive all public benefits, passing the public ways unmolested, or to self-shield at home or voluntarily chosen location without interference or limitation, as an expressive association Right.
